GENERAL NOTES

1. The above list has been developed and will be maintained by the Estuary and Beach & Rock subcommittee. Clubs wishing to vary the eligible species should present a case to the subcommittee.
2. Sharks exclude all Wobbegong, Carpet, Port Jackson, Cat, Leopard, White Pointer, Grey Nurse and Tiger Sharks.
3. Department of Fisheries or AAA listed minimum lengths apply. This is a species list and only a guide to state size limits for more detailed information refer to Recreational fishing guide 2013.
4. Plate references are a guide only and are taken from Sea Fishes of Southern Australia (Barry Hutchins and Roger Swainston). Plate references in ***bold Italics*** are from The Marine Fishes of North Western Australia (Gerald R. Allen and Roger Swainston).
5. All species of fish that are not on the species list are not eligible to be weighed in. This includes all species that were in the "Other" category.
6. Only one set of species points are awarded for each Ref no. group and a maximum of 8 individuals in each Ref no. can be weighed in (state limits allow less than 8 for some species).
7. Pink Snapper size and bag limits vary by location and season.
8. Outlined in the Recreational Fishing Guide 2013 published by the Department of Fisheries, imposes the following mixed daily bag limit restrictions:
 - a. Category D (Demersal Finfish) – maximum 2 fish per angler (West Coast) 5 fish (Rest of State)
 - b. Category P (Pelagic Finfish) – maximum 3 fish per angler
 - c. Category 2 (Near Shore Estuarine) – maximum 16 fish per angler.
Wrasse (Ref 47) - bag limit one all species combined (AAAWA limit)
 - d. Category 3 (Unlisted species) – maximum 30 fish per angler
The category for each species is shown in the Eligible Species list.
9. Species, bag limits, categories and minimum sizes are those published by the Department of Fisheries in the Recreational Fishing Guide 2013. Rules may vary between the West Coast and other regions. Check the guide for species bag limits.
